




In What Counties Do You Work?




How Often Do You Collaborate?




With What Organizations Do You Collaborate Regularly?





Obstacles to Collaboration?

- Too many interests for action
- Political barriers
- Lack of support from agency
- Lack of knowledge of others' capacities
- "Silos" of areas of responsibilities
- Turf wars
- Special interests

Organizational Priorities for Next Year

- Provide flood risk information to resource managers
- Plan, respond and recover from disasters
- Shallow lake management, grassland management
- Protect/restore wildlife and wetland habitat
- Reduce flood risks
- · Habitat protection, species monitoring
- Remain involved in Indian Creek WMA
- Look for funding opportunities to support work in watershed
- Permanent land protection along various river corridors
