

AWEA Comments on MMS Proposed Rule

- Publish Final Rule by end of this year
- Minimize administrative delays in leasing process
- Reduce opportunities for misuse by speculators and opponents
- Adjust approach to revenue collection
 - Omit minimum bids
 - Revise operating fee computation
- Revise financial assurance provisions
- Separate Alternate Use from the Final Rule
