

Susan Parker Bodine is the Chief Counsel for the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee.

The Committee has broad environmental and infrastructure jurisdiction, including jurisdiction over NEPA, the Endangered Species Act, the Clean Water Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the Toxic Substances Control Act, the Clean Air Act, Superfund and Brownfields, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Federal Highway Administration, Economic Development Administration, and the civil works program of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Prior to joining the Committee staff, Ms. Bodine was in private practice as a Partner at Barnes & Thornburg. Ms. Bodine also has served as the assistant administrator of Environmental Protection Agency's Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response and as the staff director and senior counsel for the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Ms. Bodine received her law degree from the University of Pennsylvania and her undergraduate degree from Princeton University.
