Nina Bell is the Executive Director of Northwest Environmental Advocates. She has been involved in all aspects of advocacy for water quality-based regulation, both nationally and in the Pacific Northwest, through TMDLs, NPDES permits, nonpoint source controls, and water quality standards. Ms. Bell has served on numerous advisory committees, including EPA's Federal Advisory Committee on TMDLs (1996-98), and she co-chaired the Lower Columbia River Bi-State Water Quality Study (1990-92).
