Sean B. Hecht is the Co-Executive Director of the Emmett Institute on Climate Change and the Environment, and Evan Frankel Professor of Policy and Practice, at UCLA School of Law. He teaches and mentors students, works with students to serve environmental advocacy organizations and public agencies in his role as co-director of the Frank G. Wells Environmental Law Clinic, and conducts research on environmental law and policy issues. Sean's areas of interest include coastal and urban climate change adaptation; the intersection of insurance and climate risk; public lands; environmental justice and equity; and environmental impact analysis. He authored a leading legal academic article on the insurance sector's relationship to climate change. Along with co-counsel in Center for Biological Diversity v. Department of Fish and Wildlife (Newhall Ranch), he received the 2016 *California Lawyer* Attorney of the Year (CLAY) Award for environmental law. Sean is a past chair of the State Bar of California's (now the California Lawyers Association's) environmental law section.
