

National Fish and Wildlife Foundation \$2.5 Billion Committed

The National Fish & Wildlife Foundation (or "NFWF") is a nonprofit organization that funds conservation projects across the United States. As part of the criminal settlements the federal government reached with BP and Transocean (two companies involved in the oil spill), NFWF is receiving money for projects that benefit natural resources harmed by the oil spill.



How much money has been allocated?

NFWF is receiving more than \$2.5 billion over a five-year period (from 2013-2018). So far, ~\$500 million of that money has been allocated to projects.



Who pays?

The money is coming from BP and Transocean.

Who is in charge?

NFWF decides how the money is spent, but must consult with federal and Gulf state agencies. It must also follow rules set out in the criminal settlements.
